

The Fallbrook Historical Society, chartered in 1976, is dedicated to collecting, preserving and displaying the history and artifacts of the Fallbrook area. The all-volunteer organization provides tours for school children, a destination for tourists, and research facilities for genealogists and history buffs.

Our museum complex is composed of three separate buildings:

- I. The Main Museum
- II. The Historic Pittenger House
- III. The Donald J. Rivers Interpretive Center (aka The Barn)

I. The Main Museum includes:

Fallbrook in Miniature – a working model train display featuring replicas of twelve Fallbrook buildings from 1882 to the early 1900s. These buildings were created by Fallbrook resident Geno Somacal and donated to our museum by his widow, Babs Somacal. A train passes through the Village as it did from the late 1800s through the middle 1900s. The display is altered to show seasonal changes.



- Native American and Early Settler displays.
- Displays of agriculture, education, the military, civic organizations, business, home life, the railroad and the fire department.



- Our Research Library
- The Bud Francis & Parkg
 McLgan Collection of rocks and minerals is representative of the San Diego County area.



The <u>Ford Room</u> – Antique Ford automobiles on display are a 1923 Model T, a 1930 Model A 2-door coupe and a 1930 Model A 2-door convertible coupe.





II. The Historic Pittenger House



Built in 1895 by Rev. William Pittenger, a Methodist Minister and one of the first Civil War soldiers to receive the Medal of Honor. The house is furnished with period pieces.

III. The <u>Ponald J. Rivers</u>
<u>Interpretive Center</u> is our new barn structure. It will house antique farm machinery, tool collections, an extensive barbed wire collection, two working



looms, quilt displays, and depictions of life in the early days of Fallbrook.
